Warm greetings!



WRITING PRACTICE

- Practice writing 2 pages each of letters L, T, H and I.
- Complete pages 10 to 23 of the PATTERN BOOK.
- Let your child scribble and color.

COMMUNICATION SKILLS

- Read a picture book with your child daily. This will enhance vocabulary and develop a love for books at an early age.
- Pretend play a phone call with your little one. This will enhance your child's speaking skills and help him/her understand basic phone etiquette.
- While having meals with your child, talk about the importance and hard work of the farmers and ask him/her not to waste food.
- Share stories about your childhood and your family history.

SOCIAL SKILLS

- Visit 3 neighbors. Know more about them and build a rapport with them.
- Let your child make a card for the grandparents and visit them. Their love and emotional support is very important for your child. Click snaps with them.
- Take your child to your work spot and let him/her know how you work to support the family.
- Visit the local fruit or vegetable market with your child.

SELF MANAGEMENT SKILLS

- Raise a kitchen garden with your child by planting seeds. Let him/her water the plants and take responsibility for some of them.
- Make your child the captain of his/her toy store. This will develop a sense of responsibility towards toys in your little one.
- Create a zigzag on the floor. Let your child walk/crawl and balance on it.
- Let your child bounce a ball.
- Prepare a DIY (do it yourself) craft with your child which to refine their motor skills.
- Allow your child to play outdoors, get hurt and get dirty. It's okay for him/her to fall down and experience pain once in a while. Comfortable life within the sofa cushions will make your child lazy.

RESEARCH SKILLS

- See how many places your child can find numbers.
- Give some things to your child. Let him/her throw them in the water to see what floats/sinks.
- Watch the stars and clouds. If possible use a pair of binoculars.
- Let your child feed the birds and observe them eat.
- Visit the park. Collect some fallen leaves and let your child observe the differences.

THINKING SKILLS

- Help your child mould potter's clay (chikni mitti) or plain flour (atta) and be creative.
- Let your child locate the letters L, T, H and I in newspaper headings and encircle them.
- Let your child locate circular things in a room or the house.
- Play board games like snakes and ladders.
- Play card games like "patte pe patta" to reinforce the concept of numbers, colors and same or different.

Create these memories. Click pictures and paste them in a scrap book to be shared in the school after vacations.

COMPETITIONS

- Prepare any Hindi/English Rhyme (not from the syllabus), for Recitation Competition to be held after Summer Break. Rhyme should be child friendly, for eg. it should be based on books/ cartoons/ family/ animals/ plants/ fruits/ vegetables/ good manners etc.
- Write the rhyme in the school diary as well for selection after summer vacation.

(NOTE: The child can participate either in English or Hindi Rhyme Recitation.)



Last but not the least, try to keep your child away from TV, mobile phones, computers and other electronic gadgets; they have their whole life for that. Look into the eyes of your little one and thank God for giving you one - wonderful gift. In a few years from now, he/she will be soaring to great heights.
